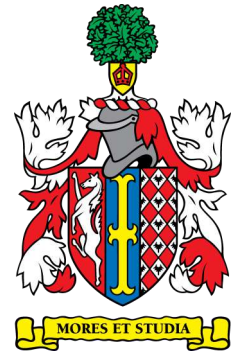

What is Up Learn?

Up Learn describes itself as “a one-stop-shop for independent learning across a whole range of STEM subjects”.

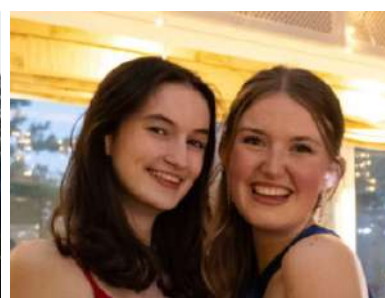

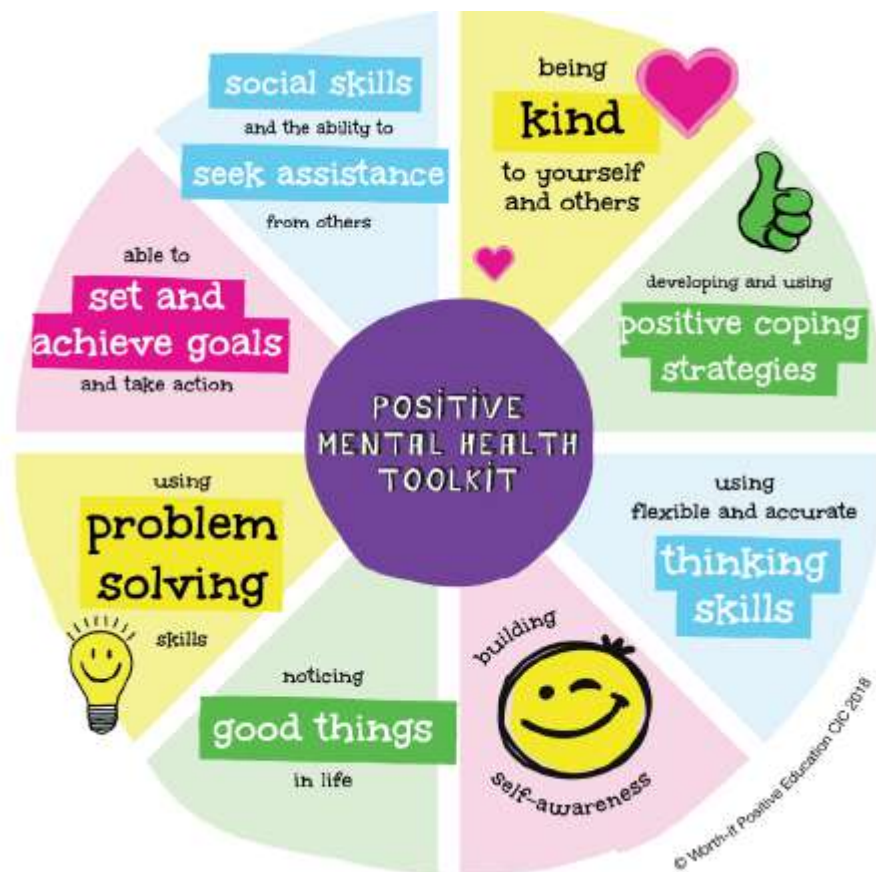

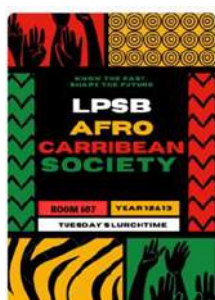
A Sixth Form-led Men's Mental Health Society:

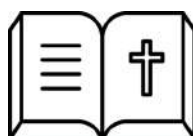
